OPEN BASS TOURNAMENT RULES

1. Open to all individuals, male and female, 18 years or older. Under 18 may participate with a parent or guardian. Driver of boat must be 18 years of age or older.
2. Any boat 14 ft. or longer is allowed. Factory installed live wells are required. Live wells will be inspected prior to launch.
3. Tournament hours will be from Safe light until 3:00 pm
4. Starting positions will be determined by order entries are received. No entries will be accepted by mail post marked after June 5, 2011. Entries will be accepted at the ramp - CASH ONLY.
5. Safe boating conduct must be observed at all times. Each competitor is required to wear a Coast Guard approved life vest, securely fastened at all times, while boat is being propelled by combustion engine.
6. Each contestant is expected to follow high standards of sportsmanship, courtesy and conversation. No boat may fish within 50 yards of another competitor, provided he is anchored with his trolling motor up.
7. Only artificial baits may be used. No live or cut bait is permitted. All bass must be caught alive in a legal and sporting manner. Only one fishing line allowed in water per angler at any given time.
8. All participants are required to abide by all State laws and game regulations.
9. A limit of 5 bass, Largemouth or Suwannee Bass, may be weighed in. Scoring will be determined by pounds and ounces. Length will be measured with the mouth closed on a golden rule. Any short fish (below 12 inches) brought to the scale will lead to the disqualification of the participant's largest fish. There will be NO COURTESY CHECKS. A 4 oz. penalty will be assessed for each dead fish brought to the scale. CULLING OF DEAD FISH IS PROHIBITED - NO CULLING AT THE RAMP.
10. Weigh-in will be on a first come, first serve basis and fish will be released after they are weighed.
11. Competitors must check in prior to weighing in fish.
12. Competitors who are not at the check-in area at weigh-in will be penalized at a rate of one pound per minute up to 10 minutes, at which time they will be disqualified. Weigh-in time will be 3:00 p.m
13. One Big Bass pot will be paid.
14. Competitors shall remain with their partners in the boat at all times during the tournament. In case of breakdown, one partner may return with fish by another tournament boat, while the partner is permitted to stay with the disabled boat.
15. Any protest must be submitted in writing to the tournament director before the close of the weigh-in. Once the awards presentation begins, all results of the contest are considered fair and final.
16. Interpretation of these rules will be left exclusively to the tournament director.
17. A polygraph test may be required of anyone accused of acquired fish illegally, if competitor does not pass polygraph test then they are not eligible for prizes and/or money. Any expense involved with polygraph test will be the protester's responsibility.
18. Alcoholic beverages will not be permitted during tournament hours, weigh-in and award ceremony.
19. All decisions by Tournament Director are final.

DIRECTIONS to CLAY LANDING

From US 19 in Chiefland: Travel West on NW 115 St / Manatee Springs Rd to NW 110 Ave. Turn Right and travel North to NW 129 Place. Turn Left and travel West to NW 130 St (129th turns into 130th). Turn Left and follow to boat ramp.
